Report Back on UN Private Sector Forum 2014

Since 2008, the UN Private Sector Forum has provided an annual opportunity for businesses to make commitments to contribute to UN development goals. Commitments are made for a variety of actions, programmes and projects, both independently and in partnership with other organizations. To ensure accountability, the UN Global Compact follows up with companies on their commitments on a two-year cycle.

In 2014, over 30 companies pledged to the UN Global Compact Business Leadership Criteria on Carbon Pricing at the UN Private Sector Forum held as part of the official programme of the UN Secretary-General's Climate Summit.

Since then, the number of companies more than doubled with nearly 70 companies across 20 sectors valued at over \$2 trillion market capitalization are taking ambitious measures to set an internal carbon price, advocate publicly for carbon markets, and communicate on progress over time. The following companies have aligned with the Business Leadership Criteria on Carbon Pricing:
