UNOSSC

About the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC)

The United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC) was established in 1978 by the UN General Assembly with the mandate to promote, coordinate and support South-South and North-South-South (triangular) cooperation globally and within the United Nations system. UNOSSC leverages its global reach and policy and institutional capacities to assist UN agencies and developing countries to strengthen their South-South cooperation capacities. It has designed an innovative 3-in-1 delivery mechanism, endorsed by the UN General Assembly that effectively identifies, shares, and transfers successful Southern-generated development solutions for capacity building and knowledge sharing. As an integral part of a support architecture, the South-South Global Assets and Technology Exchange (SS-GATE) virtual and physical system is part of UNOSSC's 3-in-1 support and service delivery architecture for South-South cooperation. It offers a global and sustainable South-South transaction system that aims to provide an enabling environment to facilitate transparent exchanges of working solutions including 1. applied technologies, 2. know-how, 3. financial resources, and 4. evidence-based policies among the private sector, public sector, and civil society for the inclusive growth of the countries in the South. As set out in the United Nations Secretary-General's 2008 policy directive, the SS-GATE programme focus areas include: a. agriculture assets and technology exchange for small and medium-sized enterprises; b. environment and clean energy exchange focusing on public-private partnerships; and, c. global health exchange to enhance the global health agendas. As of 2015, SS-GATE has established 50 country centers in 40 countries, and has listed over 7,000 projects, matched more than 300 projects, and transacted more than 1,000 projects. ssc.undp.org/
